## Children's fund names groups receiving money

The Portland Children's Investment Fund last week allocated \$2 million to 11 after-school and mentoring programs.

Half the allocation will go to organizations with annual revenues less than \$1 million, with the other half awarded to organizations with annual revenues of more than \$1 million. The grants will be disbursed during a 36month period from July 2005 through June 2008.

The organizations receiving investments are:

The after-school programs target fourth- through eighthgraders; mentoring programs serve youths ages 5 through 18. Program goals are to provide after-school alternatives, promotacademic achievement, reduce the number of juveniles victimized by crime and increase graduation rates. The fund was established by a five-year levy passed by Portland voters in 2002.

It previously allocated \$6.2 million for organizations serving children in these areas during the pasfew years. It has also granted approximately \$6.7 million for early childhood programs and \$3.1 million for child abuse prevention and intervention programs.
